Denmark electricity regulations



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The Danish Energy Agency manages the legislation on the electricity market in Denmark. Specifically, the Danish Energy Agency develops the legal framework for production, transmission, and distribution of electricity, and for competition, consumer protection and security of supply.

All electricity suppliers in Denmark have a supply obligation, which is regulated in section 6b (6) of act no. 119 of 6 February 2020, the Electricity Supply Act. As follows, electricity suppliers offering supply of electricity within a certain geographical area (grid area) must supply electricity to any household customers in that area upon ...

FOREWORD. The Danish Utility Regulator (DUR) is the regulatory authority in Denmark for the mar-kets for electricity, natural gas, district heating, and waste. The National Report summarises the main developments in the Danish electricity and gas markets during 2022, both at the wholesale and retail levels.

Energinet determines rules, condition, and methods for electricity and gas based on, for example, the Danish electricity supply act, the Danish gas supply act, and various EU regulations.

Where an electrical installation is not, or only partially, designed according to the version of the standard series for electrical installations applicable in Denmark, HD 60364, it must be documented that the safety requirement of Section 3 of the Electrical Safety Act, is met, cf. Sections 5-16 of this Executive Order.

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
