The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Namibia in collaboration with UNICEF Namibia officially launched the Vehicle-Grid-Integration (VGI) and Electric Vehicle (EV) project at its United Nations House in Windhoek today.

The Policy highlights the importance of electrification for national development, and it provides brief statements on the background, status and imperatives for further electrification before presenting the objectives and strategies that are to underpin the country's electrification approaches in the future.

Namibia has set ambitious targets to transition to a greener and more sustainable transportation system by aiming to have 96,500 light vehicles converted to battery electric vehicles (BEVs) by the year 2025, a recent study has revealed. This move is Namibia''s commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, particularly from the transport sector.

To replace 96,500 petrol cars with EVs by 2025 Namibia needs to take decisive action in both the governmental and private sector to increase EVs uptake. One of the big governmental policy changes that would be required to promote EVs is eliminating all import duties and VAT on EVs and EV charging equipment, thereby making EVs affordable to ...
