The American Honda Motor Company, which is the automaker's U.S. subsidiary, was founded in 1959 and initially sold only motorcycles. The first Honda automobile sold in the United States and Canada was the 1970 Honda N600 sedan, which was built in Suzuka, Japan and then shipped to North America.

Honda builds vehicles all over the world. Let's focus on North America for now, though, where the automaker has an absolutely massive manufacturing presence. These are Honda's North American manufacturing plants and what they build:
